"ADS" at the Crossroads: Policy, Practice, Progress"

Annually, the third week of September is recognized nationally as Adult Day Care Services Week, which was proclaimed on September 27, 1983, by former President Ronald Reagan. Adult Day Care Services Week is celebrated to raise awareness of Adult Day Care programs and services that are available nationwide for frail adults, Dementia, Alzheimer's, and persons with disabilities.

This year's theme "ADS" at the Crossroads: Policy, Practice, Progress" is designed to encourage discussions and initiatives around:

- •Policy & Advocacy: Focusing on grassroots efforts and using research to inform policy changes.
- •Provider Practice: Exploring best practices in care design, operations, and caregiver programs.
- •Progress Metrics: Emphasizing the importance of measuring the impact of adult day services through research, standards, and data collection.

The theme aims to connect the clinical and practical aspects of adult day services with broader systemic changes, motivating providers to engage in advocacy for the industry. This celebration provides an opportunity to highlight the essential services that adult day centers offer, showcase programs, and demonstrate their positive impact on participants and caregivers.

The Center plans to celebrate Adult Day Care Services Week the week of September 21-27, that will include an "Midnight at the Masquerade" Murder Mystery Dinner Theatre Fundraiser, on Saturday, September 27th, starting at 5:00 p.m., at the Squirrel Hollow Golf Course, in Battle Creek. Tickets can be purchased through Eventbrite and sponsorship packages are available. Proceeds go towards the Adult Day Care Scholarship Fund.

Center Closings, Inclement Weather, and Transportation

Listed below is some helpful information about Center Closings/No Transportation on Bad Weather Day(s).

- Remember to keep your driveway, sidewalks, and ramps salted and plowed. This will allow us to escort and transport the client safely.
- Bad Weather Days! Our policy is as follows...If schools are closed (primarily Battle Creek Public and Lakeview Schools), we will not be able to provide transportation to and from the Center. If the Center decides to remain open and not provide transportation, a staff person will call clients/caregivers to identify who will be self-transported to and from the Center. Note: If the above school districts were previously scheduled to be closed, then the Center will base our decision to not provide transportation and/or closings based on other community transportation/service providers.
- WWMT currently no longer sends Text notifications that our Center is Closed. However, you can still receive notifications regarding closings through the News Channel 3 app. Please see more information below.
- Cancellation Policy—Please call (269) 962-1750 to cancel at least 24 hrs in advance. We understand that uncontrollable circumstances do happen, so feel free to leave a message at any hour of the day. We check messages at 7:45am, M-F. Or email the following staff below. 



Ingredients

- 6 small corn or 1 large flour tortilla
- 6 eggs
- ½ cup cottage cheese
- ½ teaspoon kosher salt
- fresh ground black pepper
- 2 cups fresh spinach, finely chopped
- 1 garlic clove, minced
- 12 fresh basil leaves, chopped
- 1 roma tomato, sliced ¼ inch thick
- ½ cup sharp cheddar cheese, shredded
- cooking spray or olive oil

TOMATO BASIL QUICHE

This easy quiche is made with a tortilla crust! Packed with protein this dish is also very customisable.





COOK TIME



Instructions

- Preheat the oven to 375°F and spray a 9 inch pie pan with cooking spray
- Arrange the tortillas in the pan, overlapping them so they fully cover the sides and bottom of the pan.
- In a medium bowl whisk together the eggs, cottage cheese, salt and pepper. Stir in the spinach, garlic, & ¾ of the basil. Pour the mixture on top of the tortillas. Arrange the tomato slices on top, then sprinkle the cheddar cheese evenly over the surface.
- Bake for 30 minutes until the eggs are fully set. Remove from oven and cool for 15 minutes. Garnish with the remaining basil and flaky salt (if desired).

Notes:

 Storage: The quiche can be stored in an airtight container in the fridge for up to 5 days.

Change it up:

- Add any additional veggies that you want, such as mushrooms or peppers.
- Substitute pepper jack cheese for the cheddar.




